
We are excited to announce...

From the Instructor...

Grades 1-3: Students will start to learn Latin via the "Songschool Latin" program. Students will follow monkey, Simeon, through Latin adventures and learn basic Latin vocabulary through songs and chants.

Grades 4-6: Students will learn Latin via the "Latin for Children: Primer A" book. This is a great continuation of the Latin students have learned in the 3rd grade, but it is also possible for students to start gaining a Latin foundation with no prior Latin experience. Students will learn Latin grammar and vocabulary as well as English derivatives in a lively and interactive way, as well as follow characters, Marcus and Julia as they look for dropped coins or maybe even greater treasures, in the story, "Along the Appian Way."
